

Care Instructions Following Local Anesthesia

Your child has received local anesthesia today as part of his or her dental treatment. You should watch your child carefully to prevent him/her from chewing, scratching, or vigorously rubbing the numb area since they will feel no pain. This is most often a problem when the lower jaw is numb since the numbness includes the lip, chin, and inner cheek area. The anesthesia will typically last 2-3 hours, although this time may vary.

During this time your child should avoid chewing any food on that side as this may result in inadvertent self-inflicted trauma. Maintain a soft or liquid diet only for this initial period.

Should your child inadvertently bite or chew their mouth then ulceration and swelling may occur, but should heal uneventfully in 7-10 days and leave no scarring. The area would appear whitish/yellow in color, which is not an indicator of infection, but rather represents both the traumatized tissues and the newly formed reparative tissue.
